

# **Spring Road Maintenance Underway**



As part of the municipality's ongoing commitment to road safety and community upkeep, several important maintenance initiatives are now underway across local hamlets and rural routes.

A contractor has been secured to carry out street sweeping throughout the hamlets. This work will help improve road cleanliness, enhance safety for pedestrians and cyclists, and support stormwater management by clearing debris from curbs and catch basins.

Select gravel roads will receive fresh maintenance gravel to restore surface quality and ensure safe and smooth travel. This work is part of the municipality's regular upkeep schedule and addresses wear and tear from winter conditions.

To prepare for the dry months ahead, all gravel roads are scheduled to receive an application of calcium chloride. This dust suppressant helps improve driving visibility and comfort while also reducing road surface degradation.

Crews are actively addressing damage caused by snow plows over the winter. Repairs include pothole patching, grading, and culvert inspections to ensure proper drainage and safe road conditions.

Tree and brush cleanup efforts will also be taking place in various areas across the municipality. This work will address storm damage and support overall road safety.

These seasonal efforts not only help extend the life of municipal infrastructure but also demonstrate the municipality's ongoing investment in the well-being of residents. Keeping roads safe, clean, and accessible is a shared priority, and staff appreciate the patience and cooperation of the community during these essential maintenance activities.

# Message from Mayor Scott W. Anderson

Significant progress has been made since our last newsletter, with your Council continuing to focus on the goals outlined in the Township Strategic Plan. Efforts have been directed toward the municipal budget, planning for infrastructure and road needs, enhancing communication processes, and strengthening staff resources.

Council approved the 2025 Municipal Operating and Capital Budget with a net levy of \$10,301,700. This translates into a modest blended tax increase of 2.49%—

one of the lowest in Simcoe County. This equates to an estimated annual increase of \$105 for a property valued at \$500,000. I am extremely proud of Council and Staff for their diligence building a budget for now and for the future. The 2025 budget is not only a financial plan - it's a reflection of Council's commitment to infrastructure, environmental sustainability, improving the quality of life for residents community vitality. Capital investments include \$2.7 million in road and infrastructure construction, \$280,000 for fire department equipment and gear, \$138,000 in water and wastewater upgrades, \$418,000 for our parks and recreation, \$162,000 for office technology upgrades, and the addition of four staff positions to improve the services we can provide to residents.

On behalf of Council, I was pleased to welcome our new Chief Administrative Officer Chris Kalimootoo to the Township. Mr. Kalimootoo brings a wealth of experience in the municipal sector to this role. Council is keen on working with our new CAO to keep moving forward with goals and providing excellent service for the community. I thank retired CAO Eric Wargel for returning to fill the role of Interim CAO during the recruitment period. His service and valued advice was appreciated, and his efforts advanced our Township in so many ways.

I wish to congratulate Chris Rutters on her retirement as Deputy Treasurer after 21 years with the Township. Chris's steadfast service to Adjala-Tosorontio showed in everything she did with the Finance Department, from serving customers at the counter or on the phone, to providing information and corporate knowledge to staff and myself. I wish her all the best as she enjoys more time with family and playing cards with friends.



## **Hamlet History**

The community of Sheldon was first settled in 1834 when John Alexander was granted a parcel of land in Concession 1 of Mono Township. A creek ran through his property, flowing east into Adjala Township before eventually joining the Nottawasaga River. Recognizing the potential for water power, Alexander built a home and a large grist mill. This development attracted other tradespeople leading to the formation of a small hamlet.



George E. Parker later arrived, took over operation of the mill, and opened a general store. By the 1860s, Sheldon had grown into a bustling little settlement. In those early days, farmers often had to stay overnight while waiting for their flour to be milled. During the busy season, they sometimes remained for several days, and the mill-house was converted into a guesthouse to accommodate them. Sadly, the original mill was destroyed by fire on June 27, 1963, the cause of which remains unknown.

# Municipal Sewage Decreased by 20%



Effective April 1, 2025, Council has approved a temporary change to the sewer use rate that will benefit residents throughout the community.

What does this mean for you? Starting in Quarter 2 (April 1 – July 1, 2025), residents will notice a 20% reduction in their sewer usage calculation.

#### Here's how it works:

For residential properties connected to the wastewater system, the wastewater rate is applied to 80% of total water usage that is read by your meter.

#### For example:

100 cubic metres x \$5.43 (current sewer rate) =  $$543.00 \times 80\% = $434.40$ .

This adjustment reflects a savings of \$108.60/100^3.


Water and Wastewater charges are billed quarterly. The remaining 2025 Water and Wastewater due dates are July 31, 2025 and October 31, 2025.

# Municipal Property Tax Where Does it Go?

Ever wonder where your property tax dollars actually go?

Even though your property tax bill is paid to the Township of Adjala-Tosorontio, only 46¢ of every dollar stays right here in the Township. The rest? Take a look! Keep in mind: while the Township collects the full amount, we pay a portion to the County and Education for services not provided by the Township.

Residents are reminded that all new septic installations, upgrades, or repairs must be inspected and approved by the Township before any work begins to ensure compliance with safety and environmental standards. Taking the time now to care for your system can save money and stress down the road, helping to ensure a worry-free summer and a cleaner, healthier Adjala-Tosorontio. Simple practices like conserving water, spreading out laundry loads throughout the week, and avoiding the disposal of fats, oils, and harsh chemicals down the drain can go a long way in preserving the life of your septic system. By staying proactive and informed, residents can play a key role in safeguarding their homes and the natural beauty of the Township for generations to come.



### **Automatic Aid Agreement**

We've got some great news when it comes to keeping our community safe! This March, a new partnership between Adjala-Tosorontio Fire and Clearview Fire Services officially launched — and it's already making a difference.

Thanks to this Automatic-Aid Agreement, residents in the southern part of Adjala-Tosorontio (up to 100 metres south of Sideroad 30, from Concession 4 to the Mulmur-Tosorontio Townline) will now see Clearview fire trucks arriving first at most emergencies. This means even faster response times when every second counts.

But don't worry — Adjala-Tosorontio Fire is still very much involved. Our team will continue handling major incidents, fire prevention, public education, and issuing burn permits.

This collaboration is all about working together to keep our residents safe — and that's something worth celebrating!

# **Spring Cleaning? Don't Forget Fire Safety!**

As you dive into your spring cleaning, here are a few important fire safety tasks to add to your "to-do" list to help keep your home and family safe:

- Make sure your house number is easy to see from the road this helps emergency responders find you quickly if needed.
- Clean the filters above your stove built-up grease can be a hidden fire hazard.
- Vacuum the coils on your refrigerator not only does this help prevent overheating, but it also keeps your fridge running more efficiently.
- Inspect outdoor electrical outlets and appliances look for signs of animal nests and check wiring to make sure everything is in good shape.
- Check fuel containers look for leaks and ensure they're stored safely, away from heat sources.
- Clear out carports and garages remove dry leaves, trash, and anything that could catch fire. Combustible materials near hot vehicle parts (like mufflers) can pose a serious risk.

Taking a little extra time now can go a long way in preventing fires later. Stay safe!

## **Road Resurfacing**

The Township is moving forward with several road resurfacing projects this season to improve driving conditions and extend the life of local infrastructure. The following roads are scheduled for upgrades:

- Concession Road 3 from Line 6/7 to County Road 12: This stretch will undergo grinding, reshaping, and repaving to improve surface quality and safety.
- Mono-Adjala Townline from 5 Sideroad to Highway 9: Full grinding, reshaping, and repaving will be completed to address wear and tear.
- Concession Road 8 from Magnolia Ave to 5 Sideroad: Reshaping and new asphalt will create a smoother driving surface.
- 20th Sideroad (Tosorontio) from Mulmur-Tosorontio Townline to Concession Road 2: This section will be reshaped and resurfaced using tar and chip to enhance durability.
- 17th Sideroad from Concession Road 3 to Concession Road 4: Grinding, reshaping, and repaying will restore this roadway to a safer condition.

Drivers are asked to use caution and follow posted signage when traveling through construction zones. Thank you for your patience as we work to keep our roads safe and well-maintained.
